15. Membership Report Director Carole Linn

Down 34 from last year. Have 456 members YTD with 55 new members, 24 Associate members, 35 map advertisers, and 9 complimentary/honorary. Received 114 Champion Campaign donations (\$10,900 gross amount YTD) which Elaine Kloiber has been handling along with the store for many years, and 30 Groomer Replacement donations from the website which totaled \$4840.

- 16. Miss Sno-Eagle recruitment and scholarship for 2024 2025 Director Carole Linn Applications are open on our website until April 14. Holly Tomlanovich presented to Phelps High School this week. They receive \$1000 scholarship and other perks in return for representing our club at various events next year.
- 17. Social media/Facebook update Director Dan Dumas
- 18. Safety and Ride Right Campaign update Director Dan Dumas
- 19. VCSA Update President Keith Nettesheim
 - Sheriff update: there were a number of ATV/UTV citations.

- We can still get reimbursed up to 300 per mile for maintenance before July 1^{st} . We have not reached the maximum, so will update some signs and make other updates to trails before then.

- VCSA will add a discussion item next month about opening trails by club rather than by county for the years when snow is not even across the county. Would need to open and close gates to control what is open. Doug Miller mentioned that the southern part of the state uses a zone system now.

- ATV/UTV clubs are asking to use the shared snowmobile trails in the winters when there is not enough snow.

- 54,268 for \$10 AWSC passes and 51,115 for \$30 DNR passes this year for total of \$2,076,000 which is down over \$2 million from last year which was 4.3 million.
