TRAIL BOSS REPORT

We have been very busy doing some major work on the trails this summer. Trail 1, North of Eagle Lake, we had to widen some turns so we can do a better job grooming, several stumps and a few trees were also removed so we can get all of our grooming equipment scheduled on that route. Adams Road, we have plow drivers scraping the road clean, forcing us to look for alternate routes. We reopened the swamp route that was closed a few years ago, once things freeze up you will have the option to take the swamp or Adams Road to the trail. Across from Buckshots, a few large trees were removed and stumps were ground. Thanks to Chuck Healy, Americas Best Tree Service for his professional service. Again, we will be able to access this trail with and make our trails safer by removing the stumps. We have a number of other areas where stumps will be ground, making our trails safer. Trail 10, where Katie Lake ends and you cross Highway G, there was a hairpin turn on a slight hill, trees and bushes are taking over the trail and the hill has taken on some erosion over the years. We will be widening this turn and grading it so we can do a better job with the groomer and snowmobilers will have better visibility as they come into the turn. We have a few other areas where signage and fencing will be added to slow down sleds and keep people on trails. Reminder to all. Stay on marked trails only. Respect landowners and if you see someone riding off trail, get pictures and report them. Riding on most of our trails is a privilege and if people are going to abuse those privileges, we could lose trail access. Every year we have to deal with a number of people that simply do not respect the use of trails.

Our building Maintenance Manager: James Runte has been doing a fantastic Job getting things in order. Again, many volunteers have been helping and our shop is in tip top shape along with our brushing equipment and drags. A lot of welding, replacing blades, fixing lights, hydraulic hoses and painting. Outstanding work by the team! Thanks to all that help!

Our Equipment Manager: Doug Miller just took on this responsibility this spring and has recruited a number of guys to help with Piston Bully Maintenance - fluids, filters, electric, cleaning and repairing our Bully's getting them ready for the season. In addition, we will be getting our new 2021 Piston Bully early October. Doug will be implementing some Preventative maintenance programs and training programs for the maintenance crews and operators. Again, so refreshing to see a number of people involved, the attention detail and care that is going into these machines. Thanks to all for the hours and service provided.

MEMBERSHIP NOTES

REMINDER: The membership year for Sno-Eagles and the AWSC ends on June 31 each year. More that 100 of you have already renewed your membership and we really appreciate your promptness. If you haven't done so, go to our website: www.snoeagles.org and renew today. You can't purchase your discounted trail passes for this season until your membership is current.

Encourage your non-member friends to join and become part of the Sno-Eagles family. Our family membership dues are \$50 which includes both the Sno-Eagles and AWSC memberships.

If you know someone who would like to join Sno-Eagles, they can download an application on the club website..

We have added a new individual membership category in addition to the family membership. Both of these have an annual membership fee of \$50. This includes both Sno-Eagles and the AWSC. We also have an Associate Family Membership. This is for those folks who are current members of another Wisconsin snowmobile club and pay their AWSC dues though that club. In this case we won't collect dues for AWSC and only charge the \$25 Sno-Eagles Dues. On the application, you must provide the name of your other club and your AWSC number. **Associate members must buy their trail passes through your other club.**

There is a place on our application to indicate areas of interest. We encourage everyone to check at least one item. There is also a place for a groomer fund donation. NOTE: Sno-Eagles is now a 501c3 organization and donations to Sno-Eagles are now tax deductible. You have the option to make for a voluntary \$20.00 donation if you choose to get your newsletter via USPS mail to help cover the cost of postage and printing. Remember, our newsletter is posted on the club website and you will receive an email with a link to the new newsletter each month to alert you that it is now posted. So, for most people it's not necessary to receive a paper copy.

DISCOUNTED TRAIL PASSES

Trail Passes for 2022/23 are now available. ALL sleds (except antique sleds) need a trail pass sticker in Wisconsin. As a current member of both the AWSC and Sno-Eagles, you can purchase stickers for your personal sleds registered in Wisconsin at the discounted rate of \$10 for each sled. Go to www.awsc.org for more information. Our website also has a link to AWSC to purchase the discounted trail passes. The process is very easy and quick.

The process is very easy:

1. You do need your AWSC member number from the address label on your Wisconsin Snowmobile News magazine or the AWSC website. Call or email Ken Storms if you can't find your number. (715-479-5599 or snoeagles@gmail.com)

2. You also need the current Wisconsin registration sticker number for each sled. (go to the garage and look at your sleds or go the DNR Go Wild page on your computer.

3. You must buy them directly from the AWSC either on line or by mail using the form on page 6 of the September Wisconsin Snowmobile News magazine. On line purchases are preferred and are encouraged by AWSC.

SNOWMOBILE SAFETY SCHOOL

At this time, we are planning on conducting our annual WDNR Snowmobile Safety education class on October 21 & 22

The course will be taught by Sno-Eagles volunteer WDNR certified snowmobile safety instructors.

Any person who is born on or after January 1st, 1985 and who has reached the age of 12, must have completed and received a snowmobile safety certificate to operate a snowmobile on public trails in Wisconsin. There is no minimum age required to attend the safety course, but certificates are not valid in Wisconsin until the student has reached 12 years of age.

The snowmobile safety course consists of eight hours of basic instruction in the principles of snowmobile safety. It will be held Friday, October 21st from 6 to 9 PM and Saturday, October 22nd from 8:30 AM to 3 PM. Attendance at both sessions is mandatory.

The class will be held at Trees for Tomorrow in the large classroom. Trees for Tomorrow is located at 519 E. Sheridan Street in Eagle River, WI.

A Wisconsin DNR customer ID number is required before enrolling in any safety class. Students are encouraged to obtain a DNR customer ID and enroll online at Wisconsin DNR [GoWild](#). An ID number can also be obtained by calling DNR Customer Service from 7AM to 10PM at 1-888-936-7463, or by visiting a DNR Service Center during regular scheduled hours. The ID number must be provided to the instructor. In addition, once students have a WDNR customer ID number, they can enroll by contacting the lead instructor, Scott Linn, directly at 850-496-7324 or email [Scott](#).

The course fee is \$10 which covers all materials.

4. Opening Comments: Virtual Broadcast Announcements - Pres. Nettesheim
 - a. Thank you to the meeting sponsors: Body Craft Collision Repair and refinishing, American Family Ins.-Dave Mroczynski, Duwayne Kreager Ins. Center Inc., World Snowmobile Headquarters, Eagle River. Special thanks to Dan Dumas for broadcasting and Dean at Blue Heron for hosting.
 - b. Brian Hunter won the 50/50 and all was donated back to the Backpack Program.
5. Secretary Report: A motion to approve minutes from March 17, 2022 was made by Carole Linn & seconded by Holly T. Motion carried.
6. Treasurer's Report – Treas. Fred R.
 - a. The club ended the year financially stable. The GTR fundraiser netted \$20,000. If you would like more detailed report, please contact Fred Rockafellow. Loan was secured with a fixed rate for the 2021Pisten Bully. Keith and Fred will close on this loan May 10th, 2022.
7. Special Announcement - Pres. Nettesheim
 - a. Charlie Check was nominated and voted in as the new Vice President.
8. Director Vacancy - Pres. Nettesheim
 - a. There is currently an opening on the board for a director with Charlie moving into the vice president position. The director is required to have their primary residence in the Eagle River area. The board would like to see the position filled in the next 30-60 days.
9. Trail Report - Pres. Nettesheim will assume trail boss role until someone is appointed. At this time duties are being divided amongst other volunteers.
 - a. Trail Brushing- Trails closed March 18th and 2 crews were out brushing while the ground was still frozen to prepare the trails to turnover to the ATV Club.
 - b. Equipment Maintenance-A schedule will be created for summer maintenance on the PB13 & PB17 as well as the drags.
 - c. Positions-If anybody is interested in holding a position with the trails, contact Keith.
 - d. PB11 was traded in on the PB21. PB21 is a new demo that will be delivered this fall.
10. Fundraising Report - Charlie Check
 - a. Groom to Ride-Record results this year. Thanks to all who helped sell tickets!
